## **1915 - 24 APRIL - 2006** 91<sup>st</sup> Remembrance Day of the Armenian Genocide

# The path to prevention of crimes against human rights begins with recognition and reconciliation.

April 24, 1915 marks the beginning of the genocide of the Armenians in Ottoman Turkey. On the evening on this day hundreds of Armenian intellectuals, teachers, doctors and political leaders were arrested and executed shortly after. This became the beginning of the annihilation of 1,500,000 Armenians, i.e. 75% of the Armenian population in the Ottoman Empire and almost 40% of the entire Armenian world population.

The Ottoman Empire should be cleaned up of the Armenians and the Lebanese. We have destroyed the former by the sword, we shall destroy the latter through starvation. Enver Pasha; One of the triumvirate rulers, publicly declared on 19 May 1916...
